


State of South Carolina Know all men by these presents that I Joseph M. Glaughlin of Greenville District in the State of South Carolina labourer, in consideration of the sum of Six hundred Dollars to me paid by Thomas Underwood of Spartanburg District in the State aforesaid. Have granted bargained sold and Released and by these presents do Grant bargain sell and release unto the said Thomas Underwood all that plantation or tract of Land containing three hundred acres be the same more or less. Situate lying & being in Greenville district in the State aforesaid, on Princes Creek waters of Enoree River, the same being part of two tracts of Land originally granted to Joseph M. Glaughlin bearing date the 21st day of January A.D. 1785. and the first day of January 1789. Reference therunto being had will more fully appear Beginning on a Pine corner marked 3+ thence S. 60. W. 94. C. to a red oak marked 3+ thence N. 20. W. 20. Chain to a black Jack marked 3+ thence S. 80. W. 25. C. 50 links to a red oak marked 3+ thence N. 40. W. 27. C. 50 links to a post oak marked 3+ thence S. 50. W. 85. Ch. to the creek, thence up the meander of the creek to the upper line of the survey thence N. 30. E. 30. C. to the beginning

Together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments, & appurtenances to the said Premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining. To Have & To Hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Thomas Underwood his heirs and assigns forever, and I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors & administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the s^d Premises unto the said Thomas Underwood his heirs and assigns forever, against myself my heirs, and against every Person whomsoever Lawfully Claiming or to Claim the same or any part thereof —
