This Indenture made this Twentysixth day of July one thousand eight hundred and five between Joseph Reasonover of the State of South Carolina and Greenville District of the one part and James Tinsley of the other part of the aforesaid State and District. Witnesseth that the said Joseph Reasonover for the consideration of the sum of four hundred dollars paid by the said James Tinsley the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, and that the said Joseph Reasonover have granted bargained and sold unto the said James Tinsley a certain tract or parcel of land containing three hundred acres more or less it being a part of three surveys two of them granted to Abediah Hooper Senior one thousand seven hundred and eighty one, the other one granted to Abediah Hooper Junr: one thousand seven hundred and eighty seven. Beginning at a hickory running South Course to a conditional line made between Lewis Mabry and Richard Hooper, down said line to Mabry Spring branch but now William Hooper's thence down said branch to Cottonwood Creek to a maple from thence to a red oak corner thence along a conditional line to Norris Spring branch being a conditional line between Richard Hooper & James Hooper up said branch to a conditional line between Richard Hooper & Thomas Hooper
