 Dollars to us in hand paid by Benjamin Arnold of the State and District aforesaid, hath  
 granted bargained sold and released, and by these presents do grant bargain sell  
 and release unto the said Benjamin Arnold all that plantation or tract of land contain-  
 ing fifty five acres, less the same more or less, situate in the District aforesaid lying on  
 the south fork of horse creek waters of Reedy River, Beginning on a red oak 3<sup>rd</sup> running thence  
 N. 40. W. 28 ch. to a stake 3<sup>rd</sup> bounding on Henry Burrours land thence N. 60. E. 24 ch. to a  
 stake 3<sup>rd</sup> thence S. 30. E. 23 to a stake 3<sup>rd</sup> the last mentioned lines bounds on Benjamin  
 Arnolds land thence S. 47. W. 22 ch. on the ancient boundary line to the Beginning  
 Together with all and singular the rights members hereditaments & appurtenances  
 to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining) To Have and To Hold  
 and singular the premises before mentioned unto the Benjamin Arnold his heirs and  
 assigns forever, and we do hereby bind ourselves our heirs Executors & Administrators  
 to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Benjamin  
 Arnold his heirs and assigns against ourselves, and our heirs, and against all persons  
 whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof —  
 (Witness our hands) and seals this seventeenth day of February in the year of
