and furniture, Together with all <sup>the</sup> my household furniture, To have and to hold  
the s<sup>d</sup> bargained property unto the said Arical & Osburn their Executor administrators  
and assigns forever, and I the said John Tate for myself my Executor & administrators  
shall and will warrant and forever defend against all Persons by these presents the s<sup>d</sup>  
bargained property unto the s<sup>d</sup> Arical & Osburn their Executor administrators and assigns  
Provided Nevertheless that if I the said John Tate my Executor Administrators  
and assigns or any of us do and shall well and truly pay or cause to be paid unto  
the said Arical & Osburn their Executor administrators or assigns the sum of Twenty  
three Dollars fifty Cents on the first day of June next ensuing the date hereof  
with lawfull interest for the same for redemption of said bargained property then  
these presents bill of sale to be void or else to remain in full force, In Witness
