Together with all and singular the rights members Hereditaments & appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining. To Have and To Hold all and singular the Premises before mentioned unto the said Benjamin Land his heirs and assigns forever, Witness my hand and seal this first day of November one thousand Eight hundred and two. & in the twenty seventh year of the Independence of the United States of America.
