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This Indenture made this 28th day of February one thousand Eight hundred and nine, between John Butler of the one part & Nathaniel Dacus of the other part, and both of the State of South Carolina Greenville district. Witnesseth that the said John Butler for and in Consideration of the sum of Eighty one Dollars & 87^{1/2}cts to him in hand paid, the receipt whereof acknowledged, hath bargained and sold and by these presents do bargain sell alia Release & confirm unto Nathaniel Dacus Sewⁿ all that tract or parcel of land containing one hundred and Eighteen acres it being a part of a tract of 396 acres originally granted to William Ketcheson and Recorded in Grant Book C. No 5 page 180. & conveyed from said Ketcheson to John Peck and from John Peck to said Butler the land is situate in the State and District aforesaid on the side of Quinans creek & on some branch of said Creek bounding on the West side of the old boundary line, on the N^o by John Dacus land on the west side by William Obriants land & also grant to Isaac Perkins on the south side by land granted to Battie Birdsong and hath such shape form battings & boundings as both appear from a plat annexed to original grant (and further) the said John Butler doth covenant and agree to and with the said Nathaniel Dacus that the above described land is free & clear from every manner of incumbrance whatsoever, and that he will forever warrant the said one hundred
