 William Bullion of the State and district aforesaid, for and in consideration
 of thirty dollars to me in hand paid by Jane Grayhaw also of the said
 district and State the receipt is hereby acknowledged. Have granted bargained
 and sold and by these presents do grant bargain sell and convey a parcel
 of Land whereon she lived, containing forty acres more or less, being lying
 in Greenville District & on the waters of Broad River and bounded as followeth
 Beginning on a post oak corner in Beasons line running from thence a
 Conditional line to a Chestnut corner, thence with Bullions old line to
 the Beginning, which land was granted to Robert Prince the tenth day of
 November one thousand seven hundred & Eighty. By his Excellency Tho:
 Pinckney Governor for the time being & conveyed from Prince to Bullion it
 being a part of a large tract. To Have & To Hold all and singular the
 premises before mentioned unto the said Jane Grayhaw & her heirs forever
 & I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors &c to warrant and forever
 defend the said premises from me & my heirs & from every other Person or Persons
 lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof. As Witness
 my hand and seal this first day of March one thousand Eight hundred &

 Land containing fifty acres more or less. Situate in the district and State aforesaid
 being part of two tracts of land one originally granted to David Brown the other
 originally granted to Wm Mastin, Beginning on a red oak on a conditional between
 James Linsley & said Southern thence said line to a spanish oak corner thence
