

 and forever relinquish unto the above named James Harrison his heirs  
 and assigns all her interest and estate and also all her right & claim of  
 power of, in or to all and singular the premises above mentioned &  
 released, of three hundred and thirty five acres of Land Given under  
 my hand and seal this 13<sup>th</sup> day of February 1810.

State of Carolina. Know all men by these presents that I Benjamin  
 Jones of Greenville District and State aforesaid in consideration of the sum of two  
 thousand and fifty dollars paid by John Brasher of District and State aforesaid  
 Have granted bargained sold and released, and by these presents do grant bargain  
 sell and release unto the said John Brasher all that parcel of Land bounded  
 as follows; Beginning on a forked red oak on the North bank of Rocky River, it  
 being a corner of said John Brashers land and runs thence N.E. on S<sup>r</sup> Brashers  
 line to a pine corner, thence on Wm Ashmores running S. 21. E. crossing Rock  
 creek by chains to Sam Steels line on said Steels line S. 49. N. 8 chains to a white  
 oak corner on the north bank of said Rock creek, thence to where it runs
