Know all men by these presents that I Margaret Devenport of the State and district afores<sup>d</sup>. widow, for and in consideration of the sum of two hundred Dollars to me in hand paid by Hewlet Sullivant of the said State and District Have granted bargain sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and Release unto the said Hewlet Sullivant and his a plantation or tract of land containing one hundred acres more or less situate in Greenville district on Horse creek of Roedy River. Beginning on Horse creek Draining N. 50 E. on said Sullivants land to a red oak corner, thence N. 40 W. on Hudson Berrys land to a dividing corner, between said Devenport and Luke Bampton and thence along the dividing line between said Devenport & Bampton to Horse Creek, and then down said creek to the Beginning, it being part of a tract originally granted to John Deering and by him conveyed to Stephen Sullivant and by him conveyed to Joseph Devenport & by him to his wife Margaret Devenport and from her to said Hewlet Sullivant. Together with all and singular the rights members hereditaments & appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining. To have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned of one hundred acres of land more or less unto the said Hewlet Sullivant his heirs and assigns forever and I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors and assigns to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Sullivant his heirs and assigns against all and every
