Townson of Greenville District and State aforesaid in consideration of three  
hundred Dollars to me in hand paid by Benjamin Bristor of the State and district  
aforesaid. Have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents, do  
grant bargain sell and release unto the said Benjamin Bristor a plantation or  
tract of Land containing two hundred and seventy four acres be the same  
more or less. Situate in Greenville District lying on Little Horse Creek waters  
of Ocedy River, Beginning on a beach 31 running thence N. 20 E. 31.50 to a Post oak  
31 bounding on William Lees land thence S. 30 E. 38.00 to a hickory 31 bounding  
on Jonathan Johnsons land, thence N. 65 E. 17.40 to a red oak 31 bounding on  
Benjamin Arnolds land thence S. 30 E. 54.40 to a red oak 31 bounding on the said  
Arnolds land, thence West 40.40. to a red oak 31 bounding on Joseph Hills lands  
thence S. 65. N. 33.40 to a stake 31 bounding on William Browns land thence N. 58  
18. to a white oak 31 near a branch bounding on Ninemon Bullicans land thence N.  
30. E. 35.00 down the meanders of said branch to a beach on little horse creek, thence  
N. 65 N. 21. up the meanders of said creek to the Beginning. being part of a tract  
of 514 acres of Land originally granted to Hendrick Arnold on the 17<sup>th</sup> day of June  
1790: and by different conveyances conveyed to the said Benjamin Townson

Together with all and singular the right, members, hereditaments, appurtenances to the  
said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining I do have and do hold  
all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Benjamin Bristor to him
