March in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and ten and in
thirty fourth year of American Independence, between Henry J. Walker Sheriff
of Greenville district in the State aforesaid, of the one part, & William Choice, Planter, of the
State and district aforesaid, of the other part, Whereas John Arnold of the State and district
aforesaid was lately seized in his demesne as of fee, or of and in some other good lawful
estate of inheritance to him and his heirs and assigns forever, and possessed of the plantation
Lands, Tenements & hereditaments hereby conveyed, and intended to be herein after more
particularly mentioned and described. Whereas also James Thompson did lately that is to say
on or about the first day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred
and Eight before the justices of the Court of Common Pleas held at Greenville Courthouse
in and for the district of Greenville, in the State aforesaid before the justices of the said Court
duly obtained and entered up judgment against the said John Arnold for the sum of
Twenty one dollars & Seventeen Cents & Interest thereon amounting to one dollar & ten cents
and also for the sum of Seventeen dollars & forty five Cents for his costs & charges by him expended
in and about prosecuting his suit in this behalf, as in and by the said judgment & other
proceedings duly entered up & remaining of Record in the Office of the Clerk of the said
Court, at Greenville Courthouse aforesaid, (reference being thereunto had) will more fully appear,
And Whereas in pursuance of said judgment there was sued out of said Court of Common
Pleas, a certain writ of Fieri Facias dated at Greenville (S.C.) aforesaid on the first day of April
