-tion of the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars to me paid by George W.
Owen of the County aforesaid, Have granted bargained sold & released
and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said
George W. Owen one hundred and ten acres of Land lying in Greenville
County on the Pigeon Root branch waters of Needy River being part of a
tract of two hundred and twenty acres of Land originally granted to Henry
Black and signed by his excellency William Moultrie on the fifth day of
June one thousand seven hundred and eighty six the said one hundred
and ten acres is laid out unto the said George Owen as follows
