State of South Carolina, This Indenture made the sixth day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ten, and in the thirty fifth year of American Independence, between H. J. Walker Sheriff of Greenville District in the State aforesaid, of the one part, & Eli Baldwin of the State & District aforesaid, of the other part whereas Richard Harrison of the State & District aforesaid, was lately seized in his domestic as of fee, or of & in some other good Lawfull estate of inheritance to him & his heirs and assigns forever, and possessed of the plantation lands tenements & hereditaments hereby conveyed & intended to be hereinafter more particularly mentioned and described, whereas also Thomas Tarrant did lately that is to say on or about the 4th day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and nine before the Justice of the Court of Common Pleas held at Greenville Courthouse in & for the district of Greenville in the State aforesaid before the Justice of the said Court duly obtained & entered up Judgment against the said Richard Harrison for his costs & charges by him expended in & about prosecuting his suit in that behalf and by the said Judgment & other proceedings duly entered up and remaining of Record in the office of the Clerk of the said Court at Greenville Courthouse aforesaid, reference being thereto had will more fully appear. And whereas in pursuance of said Judgment there was sued out of the said Court of Common Pleas a certain writ of Five Fideias dated at Greenville Courthouse aforesaid on the day of _____ in the year _____ and in the _____ year of American Independence
