Viz one black mare two feather beds and furniture & a horse which I am to receive from Robert Benson, to be valued according to a certain job of work which myself S. son is now engaged in, one Cotton wheel two pots & one oven, together with all other articles of household & kitchen furniture also my corn fodder &c. my S. son John Lefo To have & To hold as a gift the above S. property & every part and parcel thereof from me my heirs and assigns & from all and every other Person or Persons -

S. Carolina Greenville District, Know all men by these presents that I James Pennington have this Seventh day of February 1811. sold and delivered unto Willey S. Brown for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred Dollars which I owed him for a note I have this day lifted for one hundred Gallons of whiskey due last Christmas & one unsettled acct. one still & vessels thirty head of hogs one cow & yearling one feather bed & furniture, and all my household implements, As Witness my hand and seal. Witness Present John Cochran, Clarissa Brown, James Pennington

We see James Pennington deliver unto Willey S. Brown one still computed to hold one hundred gallons the worm belonging thereto, seven stands two close barrels one cow and yearling thirteen head of hogs one bed and furniture one large wheel table & two bedsteads, three pails one trunk six tin cups, six knives & forks, Witness our hands this 25th day of February, 1811 - John Cochran, Clarissa Brown
