of the sum of forty Dollars to me in hand paid by Horatio Griffin State and
District aforesaid, Have bargained sold and by these presents do grant bargain
sell and release unto the said Horatio Griffin his heirs and assigns a tract of Land
containing Eighty six acres be the same more or less, situate on the waters of Laurel
Creek, Beginning on a poplar running N. 30 W. 50 to a stake thence N. 40 E. 45 ch. to a
Black, thence S. 48 E. 20 ch. to a stake thence S. 48 W. 4 ch. to a Post oak thence S. 41 W. 35
ch. to a maple on the branch, thence down the various courses of the said branch
to the Beginning, including the above mentioned Eighty six acres, To Have & To Hold
all singular the Rights members hereditaments and appurtenances unto the said Horatio
Griffin his heirs administrators and assigns, and I the said John Shelton do warrant & forever
defend the said above mentioned tract of Land unto the said Horatio Griffin his heirs
administrators and assigns against myself my heirs or assigns or any other Person whomsoever
