This Indenture made this Eleventh day of January in the year of our Lord one
Thousand Eight hundred and twelve, between John Wood Sheriff of Greenville district
in the State aforesaid of the one part, And John Hall of the district and State
aforesaid of the other part, Witnesseth that whereas Jason Plant was lately
seized in his demense as officer, or of and in some other good and lawful
estate of inheritance to him and his heirs and assigns forever and possessed
of a certain house and out house and two lots of Land, supposed to contain
one acre, situated in the District aforesaid in the village at Greenville
Courthouse known and distinguished in the plan or chart of said Village
by the numbers forty and forty one (40 & 41) intended to be herein
more particularly described, and whereas also one Asa Bunnell did
lately, (to wit) on or about the first Monday after the fourth Monday in
October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eleven
at the Court of Common Pleas held for the district of Greenville at Greenville
Courthouse, before the Justices of the said Court duly obtain & enter up
a Judgment against the said Jason Plant for the sum of two hundred
dollars and Interest thereon from the first day of July 1810 and also
the sum of thirty nine dollars and three Cents for his Costs and Charges by
him expended in and about prosecuting his suit in that behalf, as in and
by the said Judgment and other proceedings duly entered up and remaining
of Record in the office of the said clerk of the said Court at Greenville Court
House (reference being thereunto had) will more fully appear. Whereby
in pursuance of said Judgment there was duly sued out of the said Court
of Common Pleas a certain writ of Fieri Facias date at Greenville Courthouse
aforesaid on the first Monday after the fourth Monday in October in the
year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and Eleven, and thirty sixth
year of the American Independence, directed to all and singular the Sheriffs
