E. 16. to a Hickory, thence S 45 E 26. 25 to a Conditional corner in branch (Corner to Lot No 2) thence up the meanders of the branch to the beginning - Together with all & singular the rights, members, hereditaments, and appurtenances, to the said premises, belonging, or in any wise incident or appertaining; To have and to hold, all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Sife Waddell his heirs and assigns forever. And I do hereby bind myself my heirs, executor and administrators, to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Sife Waddell his heirs and assigns against myself & my heirs and against all and every other person or persons whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof. Witness my hand and seal this first day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty and in the thirty sixth Year of the American Independence. I know all men by these Presents, that I Joseph Chauncey of Greenville District, and State aforesaid, in consideration of one hundred dollars to me paid by Wm Alexander of the district and State aforesaid, have granted bargained sold & released and by these Presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said Wm Alexander all that parcel or tract of land containing three hundred and seventy "acres" situated on the branches of Cruple Creek in Greenville District on the waters of reedy river being part of a tract of Land containing five hundred acres, granted to James Alexander on the second day of December, one thousand seven hundred and ninety one, by his excellency Edward Rutledge. Beginning on a Pine 37 being the south west corner of said land, & running thence N. 25 E. 108 ch. to a post oak 24 thence S 40. E 11 chains to a Stake thence S 20 E 10 chains to a red oak 34 thence S. 42 E 30 chains to a red oak, thence S. 14. W. 25 chains to a Stake 34 thence S 37 E. 24 ch. to a red oak, thence S. 53. W. 10 chains to a Stake, thence N 65 W. 36 chains to a Stake thence S 25. W. 47 chains to a Stake thence N. 69 W. 6 chains to a Stake, thence N. 31 W. 11 chains to a post oak, thence N. 60 W. 14 1/2 chains to the beginning, Together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments, and appurtenances, to the said premises, belonging, or in any wise incident or appertaining; To have and to hold, all & singular the premises
