Cannon and Jesse Cannon of Greenville District in the State aforesaid in consideration
of six hundred and fifty dollars to me paid by George Green and John Green of the
District aforesaid, and State aforesaid, have granted bargained sold & released, and
by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said George Green & John
Green all that tract or parcel of land containing One hundred and fifty acres (be the
same more or less) Situate on both sides of the South fork of Sigeu river, being part
of the tract of land known by the name of Milford in said District. Beginning at an Ash
Shank, Golightly's Corner, & running up the said river & on the North side to a White Oak
Corner also on the river bank, thence crossing said river to maple Corner to Sigeu River
thence S 5° E 12.50 to a post oak, S 5° W crossing the great road & a Spring branch
19.50 to a Post oak Corner or Pector's line, N 8° E crossing the river 5.50 to a Birch
Corner N 5° E 7.50 thro a field to a White Oak Corner in a lane, N 75° W along the
lane 3 chains to a Stake Corner, N 8° E 1.40 to a Poplar stump in the upper Edge
of the Spring Corner = N 53° E 8 links, to a Stake in the center of the Spring branch
Corner - S 8° W 1 chain to a Stake Corner in the lane S 75° E 3 chs to another white
Oak Corner - N 18° W crossing a branch thro a field & crossing the Chimney Hill 56.50
to a white Oak on a line surveyed for Arthur Stafford, S 80° E Stafford & Clements line
crossing the great road 42 ch¹ to a Spanish Oak sapling, on Golightly's line
Corner, South 18 chs along said line crossing the great road to a Post oak Corner
West 15 ch to a white Oak sapling S 12° W 12 ch to a red Oak Corner on the Marsh
thence the meanders of the Marsh aforesaid to the river at the beginning.
