Smith, including one hundred acres more or less; The other originally granted to Patrick Lafferty being & lying in the County aforesaid on the South West side of Reedy river, as will more fully appear by the Plat — Also a tract of land Eighty nine acres, Originally granted to Samuel Wells, being and lying in the district afores^d. on a branch of Reedy River as will more fully appear by the Plat: Together with all and singular the rights, members hereunto, and appurtenances to the said premises, belonging or in any wise incident or appurtening, to have & to hold all and singular the premises, before mentioned unto the said A. Barnuth his, heirs & assigns forever, And I do hereby bind myself my heirs, executors and administrators to warrant & forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said A.
