Know all men by these presents that I William White of Greenville district for and in consideration of the sum of two hundred and twenty Dollars to me in hand paid by John Waldrop of the district aforesaid Have granted bargained sold and released and by these Presents do grant bargain sell & release unto the said John Waldrop a Plantation or tract of land Laying and being in the district aforesaid on a small Creek N<sup>o</sup> side of the Sacolet River beginning <sup>thence N<sup>o</sup> 65 E. 39 ch to a red oak, thence N<sup>o</sup> 5 W. 4 ch to a black oak, thence N<sup>o</sup> 45 W. 9 ch to the creek at the mouth of a branch on the N<sup>o</sup> side, thence up the various meanders of the branch to a Chestnut thence N<sup>o</sup> 65 E. 28 ch 50 l. to a black oak, at Clines corner, thence with his line S<sup>o</sup> 45 E. 15 ch, to a red oak John Hickmans corner, thence with his line S<sup>o</sup> 17 E 23 ch to a Blk. Oak Moses Whites corner, thence with his line S<sup>o</sup> W<sup>o</sup> corner crossing the Creek to the beginning, containing by estimations one hundred and seven acres, be the same more or less (being part of two tracts the lower end supposed to be sixty acres granted to John Green by Patent bearing date October 3<sup>o</sup> 1791 the other end & upper part granted by Patent to William Blayton, bearing date May 6<sup>th</sup> 1793 supposed to contain fifty acres including the improvement where the said Waldrop now lives, Together with all and singular the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises, belonging or in any wise appertaining to have & to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said John Waldrop - And I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors or administrators to warrant and for ever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said John</sup>
