relinquish all my part and power of said Estate unto said daughter Elizabeth Jane  
without dread or fear of him or any other person or persons whomsoever we and  
each of us do acknowledge the same without any condition, I say given by us  
and from under our hands and seals, and acknowledged in the present of us.
