


South Carolina Know all men by these presents that I Enoch Bruton of Greenville district and State aforesaid in consideration of the sum of five hundred Dollars to me in hand paid by Littleberry Langford of South Carolina, and Pendleton district, have granted bargained, sold & Released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and Release unto the said Littleberry Langford all that tract of land being in the distict of Greenville on south Tyger River, Beginning on a white oak on a conditional line made between Robert Nelson and Matthew Langford, running thence N 50 W to a stone corner thence S 5 W 2 E to a white oak thence W 20 Ch. to a white oak thence S 40 W 100 Ch. to a pine, thence S 50 E to a poplar on the conditional on a branch thence down the meander of said branch to the River & thence along the said line to the beginning corner, containing one hundred and fifty acres by estimation be the same more or less, the same being part of a tract of land granted to
