This Indenture made this 29th day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred
between John Linderman of Greenville County and State of South Carolina of the one part
and William Mayhall of the County and State aforesaid of the other part, Witnesseth that
the said John Linderman for and in consideration of fourteen Pounds sterling money to be
well and truly paid by the said William Mayhall agreeable to the indulgence of the
obligations which are to be given for said Lands to be given by Mayhall to Linderman whome
the said John Linderman hereby acknowledges herof and of and from every part & parcel
thereof doth acquit and discharge the said William Mayhall his heirs and assigns & for
divers good causes & considerations hereunto granted bargained & sold and confirmed
unto the said William Mayhall as follow, Beginning at a Poplar on the little branch of Andrew
Laffety's and from thence running along said Laffety's line S. E. course and thence South, & so
along said Laffety's line, & thence joining Dickens line, and thence joining Abner Shirdens
line, and from thence joining Peter Linderman's line and Benjamin Pollard's and from thence running to
a Pine 3+ from thence running N. W. 40 to a maple on a small branch, and so along down the
branch to the creek from thence running up the creek to the mouth of the small branch, that comes
down by the poplar of Laffety's station, and from thence to the said Poplar. Together with all &
Singular the houses out houses ways waters paths passages trees fences Hereditaments & appur-
tenances whatsoever to the said tract of Land so described and all the rights titles claims
claim and demand whatsoever both in Law and equity of the said John Linderman of in &
to the said premises and every part and parcel thereof for himself his heirs executors & administrators
the said plantation or tract of one hundred and twenty six ~~more~~ or less acres of land with the premi-
ses and appurtenances hereunto belonging unto the said William Mayhall his heirs & assigns
against him the said John Linderman his heirs and assigns and all and every other person or
persons whatsoever shall and will warrant and forever defend by their presents. In Witness
