State of South Carolina Know all men by these presents
that I Thomas Longden of the District of Greenville in the State
aforesaid in consideration of the sum of one Hundred Dollars to me in
hand paid by Thomas Morrow of the District & State aforesaid have granted
bargain & released and by these presents do grant bargain sell & release
unto the said Thomas Morrow Ten acres & one half of Land lying on both
sides of Reedy River more or less in Greenville District being part of a tract of
Land originally granted to Lewis Duvall by his Excellency William Moultrie
on the thirty first day of May in the Year of our Lords one thousand
seven Hundred and Eighty six as by a plat annexed to said Grant will
more fully appear; the said Ten acres & one half more or less is laid out
unto the said Thomas Morrow as follows, Beginning on a Willow oak
on the North bank of said Reedy River & running Eastward to a pine
stump from thence South Westward to a black gum on the bank of Reedy
River thence across the S. River to a Hickory, thence up the South bank
of said River to a willow oak, thence bound by a conditional line
including half an acre to a red oak from thence across to the beginning
corner, including the River with ten acres and one half more or less
(the ten acres of Land of said on the north side of the River
