all men by these presents that I James Blasingame of the State & District
aforesaid for & in consideration of Fifty Dollars to me paid by Julius Nichols
of State aforesaid and Abbeville District. Have granted bargained sold and
released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said
Julius Nichols, a certain piece or parcel of Land containing Thirteen acres
more or less situate in Greenville District on the North side of the middle fork
of Tyger River being part of a tract of Land originally granted to Michael
Miller the 21st day of January in the year of our Lord one Thousand Seven Hun-
dred and Eighty five. Beginning on the bank of the River (on the north side)
where the lower line of the Land Granted to said Michael Miller crosses the
River, running up the said River by the meanders thereof is a Iron wood Saplin
corner thence N 10 E nine chains to a post oak saplin thence S 85 E fourteen
chains twenty five links to a stake thence S 30 W along the lower line of the
above mentioned tract to the beginning. Together with all & singular the right
members hereditaments & appurtenances to the said Land belonging or in any
wise incident or appertaining. To have and to hold all & singular the
premises before mentioned unto the said Julius Nichols his heirs and assigns
forever. And I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors & Administrators
to warrant and forever defend all and singular the premises before mentioned
unto the said Julius Nichols his heirs & assigns against myself my heirs and
against every other person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the
same or any part thereof. Witness my hand & seal this Twelfth day of July
in the Year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and Eleven and in the
