And I do hereby bind myself my heirs, executors and Administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said James Taylor his heirs and assigns against myself and my heirs, and against every other person or persons whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof. Witness my hand and seal this tenth day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and five, and the thirtieth Year of the American Independence.
