Jacob Cooley Junr. his heirs and assigns against myself and my heirs, & against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof. This Indenture made this twenty fourth day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirteen, and in the thirty eight year of the American Independence, between Stephen Buttrick of the district of Pendleton & State of South Carolina of the one part, and Jacob Cooley of the County of Greenville and State above mentioned of the other part. Witnesses that the said Stephen Buttrick for and in consideration of the sum of four hundred dollars of South Carolina to him in hand paid at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents by Jacob Cooley the Rec^t. is hereby acknowledged I have bargained sold and delivered, and by these presents do bargain sell and deliver to the said Jacob Cooley a Certain tract or parcel of land by estimation three hundred and forty acres be the same more or less, it being part of two Surveys, lying and being on the north side of Saluda river in the district of Greenville, having such shapes & marks & form as is represented by the Plat annexed to each Grant for the said land, assigned by his Excellency William Moultrie to Isaac Robtson for one hundred & sixty six acres in
