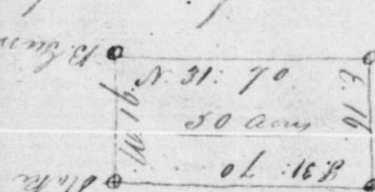

South Carolina Greenville District Know all men by these presents that I John Henson for and in consideration of the sum of fifty Dollars to me in hand paid have granted bargained sold and released unto James Ponder both of us of the State and district aforesaid a certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the district aforesaid, on a branch the waters of called the Tigger Beginning on a black gum running thence N. 31 Chains 70 links to a W. O. Abraham Thompson, corner thence with his land E. 16 Chains to a stake near a branch thence S. 31 Chains 70 links to a stake near a creek and on S. Ponder's present land thence West 16 chains to the Beginning, it supposed to contain fifty acres be the same more or less, it being part of a survey of land granted to Tho^s Henson by Patent bearing date the 25th day of Jan^y 1785. Together with all & singular the Rights, members, Accretions, and appurtenances to the S^d Premises belonging or in any wise incident to the said premises, To Have and to Hold all and singular said premises unto him the said Ponder his heirs and assigns forever against myself my heirs, and against every other person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof, In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affix my seal this fifth day of August one thousand Eight hundred & fifteen hundred fourth year of American Independence, signed and executed in presence of us - W. Stewart, J. Whetter. — John Henson (S)

478 The State of South Carolina, Know all men by these presents that I Charles Estes Sen^r of Greenville District in the State aforesaid in consideration of two hundred dollars to me paid by Joshua Estes of the State and district aforesaid have granted bargained sold and Released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and Release unto the said Joshua Estes all that plantation or tract of land containing Eighty Eight acres be the same more or less situate in the district aforesaid, laying on the waters of Horse Creek Beginning on a post oak 34 bounding on William Soms Land thence N. 60° E. 35 to a post oak 34 thence N. 7. to a stake 34 thence N. 62 W. 47: 50 to a Hickory 34 on the Waggon Road thence along the said Road to the Beginning, Together with all and singular the Rights, members, Accretions, and appurtenances belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining To Have & to Hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Joshua Estes his heirs and assigns forever,
