presents that I James Harrison of the district and State aforesaid  
for the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars paid by Alexander  
Thompson of the State and district aforesaid have granted bargained  
sold and Released and by these presents do grant bargain sell  
and Release unto the said Thompson a tract or parcel of land in  
said district containing one hundred and twenty five acres be the  
same more or less on the head branch of Cripple creek of Sandy  
River being part of a tract of six hundred acres originally granted  
to John Hickey on the 11<sup>th</sup> Sept. 1786 by Wm. Moultrie then  
Governor of S. Carolina on a post oak 34 near the head of a branch  
called the great branch thence N. 54 W. 15 to a stake thence N. 25 E. 5.  
to stake 34 thence N. 54 W. 15 to a stake near William Morrow thence  
N. 25 E. 20 to a post oak 34 near the Greenville Road thence S. 7 E.  
48 to a stake to be made on the road leading to William Alexander  
thence S. W. 23: 39: 50 to the Beginning - Together with all and singular  
the right members heretofore and appurtenances to the said premises  
belonging or in any way incident or appertaining - To Have We Hold  
the said premises as above described unto the said Alexander Thompson  
his heirs and assigns forever and I do hereby bind myself my heirs  
executors &c to warrant and forever defend the same as above men-  
tioned to him the said Thompson against myself my heirs or assigns  
and against every other person lawfully claiming or to claim the  
same or any part thereof - In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my  
hand and seal this 25<sup>th</sup> day of April 1844. Subscribed between the 19<sup>th</sup>  
and 13<sup>th</sup> being before signing - Signed sealed and delivered in presence  
of John H. Harrison Isaac Wright - James Harrison
