Know all men by these presents that I Williams Reid for and in consideration of one hundred and fifty dollars to me in hand paid by William Shackleton Junr. have bargained sold and Released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said William Shackleton Junr. one certain tract or parcel of land situated lying and being in the State and District of aforesaid containing one hundred and twenty acres be the same more or less it being part of three hundred and twenty acres granted to Joseph Reid on the 9<sup>th</sup> day of July 1790. by his excellency Chas. Pickens the above one hundred and twenty acres lying on the waters of the Horse pen creek and bounded as follows to wit beginning at a red oak S. 20 E. 24. 50 to a stake thence N. 69 E. 16 to a Red oak thence down the road to a chasmod station on the original line running nearly S. 86 E. 36. 00 thence S. 20 E. 20 to a corner white oak thence N. 85 W. 24 to a post oak thence S. 72 W. 44 to the beginning. With all and singular the privileges and appurtenances thereto belonging to him the said Wm Shackleton Junr. his heirs and assigns forever. To have and to hold use occupy possess and enjoy the above sold lands with every part and parcel thereof with all privileges and the appurtenances thereto belonging or in anywise appertaining to him the said Wm Shackleton Junr. his heirs and assigns forever And I do hereby bind myself my heirs and assigns warrant and forever defend the rights and title of the above land to the said William Shackleton Junr. his heirs and assigns forever free from the claims and demands of all person or persons whatever lawfully claiming the same or any part thereof — as Witness my hand and seal this twenty third day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and Eight.
