W. 27 1/2 50 links to a black oak thence S. 75 W. 24 chains to
a pine not, thence S. 42 W. 9 1/2 chains 50 links to a post oak
thence S. 45 E. 30 chains to a black oak thence N. 65 E. 32 chains to
a hickory thence E. 25 chains 50 links to a Stake on the bank of the River
near a small post oak Sapling, thence up the meanders of the River
to the beginning containing by Estimation one hundred and
forty nine acres be the same more or less, being part of a tract
