To have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Daniel Ford his heirs and assigns for ever; and I do hereby bind myself my heirs, Executors and Administrators to Warrant and for ever defend, all and singular the said premises, unto the said Daniel Ford his heirs and assigns, against myself and my heirs and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof. Witness my hand and seal this 19th day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixteen, and in the forty first year of the American Independence.

This Indenture made this twenty sixth day of November 1812, between Aaron Kemp of the State of South Carolina, Greenville district of the one part and Benjamin Barclay of the State and district aforesaid. Witnesseth that the said Kemp for the consideration of the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars to me in hand paid by the said Barclay the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, that he the said Aaron Kemp hath granted bargained and sold, and by these presents doth grant bargain & sell & confirm unto the said Barclay his heirs and assigns for ever: A certain tract of land containing one hundred and fifty acres, more or less, being part of a tract granted to British Colonel Sitwell in Greenville district, lying on the south side of Ewee river beginning at the fork on Kunk's branch, running up said branch bounded with land laid out for one Robert Crumling on a black oak, running up a little branch to a Stake thence N. W. corner to a hickory, then running S. Course to a poplar corner on the Mine branch thence down said branch to a hickory, thence into the cane brake branch the course S. W. to a Dogwood corner, thence S. W. course to a black oak corner, thence S. W. course to a hickory, thence S. W. course to a little branch, up S. branch to a maple corner, thence
