Beason of Greenville District and State aforesaid for and in consider-
ation of the sum of Five Thousand dollars to me in hand paid by John
Kilpatrick & Patrick Dunlap both of the district aforesaid have granted
bargained sold and released & by these presents do grant bargain sell & release
unto John Kilpatrick & Patrick Dunlap the following tracts or
parcels of land, to the same more or less, situate in the district aforesaid:
First, a tract containing two hundred and seventy four acres situate
on Enoree River beginning on a red oak the original corner & running
thence N 50 E 80 to a red oak thence N 15 W 28 to a red oak thence S 50 W 10
to a white oak thence N 82 W 15 to a Stake thence S 30 W 55 to a Stake or
original line thence with said line 40 chains to the beginning (Second)
a tract containing ten acres situate on the north side of Enoree River be-
ginning at a red oak and running thence on Mayfield's line S 40 E 15 to May-
field's Spring branch, thence down the said branch to Enoree River
thence up the meanders of S. River to where Edward Ballinger's line
crossed said river thence on said line N 30 E to the beginning (Third) a tract
containing twenty acres beginning at a maple on John Mayfield's
Spring branch and running thence S 40 E 12 chains & fifty links to a
maple on a branch thence down said branch 19 chains and fifty links
to a sweet gum thence S 5 W 7 to a water oak on the N. E. bank of Enoree
River thence up the meanders of S. River to the mouth of Mayfield's Spring
branch thence up the meanders of said branch to the beginning -
(Fourth) a tract containing twenty acres beginning at a red oak
