 describes land was conveyed to Samuel Magness & from  
 him to Charles Binson, from him to John Sammon  
 it being as aforesaid One Hundred Acres more or less,  
 together with all & singular the rights, members  
 Hereditaments, & Appurtenances thereunto belonging or  
 in anywise appertaining, unto the Said Walker Sammon  
 his heirs & assigns forever; to have & to hold the above  
 Sold Land & premises with all & singular the privilege  
 thereunto belonging or in any appertaining to him  
 the Said Walker Sammon his heirs & assigns forever, to the  
 only proper use & behoof of him the Said Walker Sammon  
 his heirs & assigns forever, to have hold use occupy possess  
 & Enjoy the same with every part or parcel thereof to him  
 the Said Walker Sammon his heirs & assigns forever,  
 against myself my heirs & against the lawful claim  
 or demand of any other person whatsoever claiming or  
 to claim the same, or any part thereof; in witness whereof  
 I have hereunto set my hand & Seal this "28." day  
 of "December" One thousand eight hundred and "seven"  
 & "30." of American Independence. Signed Sealed &  
 delivered in presence of.

 himself at the same time in the presence of each other were
