

The State of South Carolina. I know all men by these presents that I Henry Clark of Greenville district and State aforesaid in consideration of five dollars to me paid by Joseph Clark of the district and State aforesaid, have granted bargain sold and released, and by these Presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said Joseph Clark, all that tract or parcel of land lying on both sides of Vaughans Creek, branch of North Pacolite river, Beginning on a Red oak (a corner of the tract of Land whereon the P. J. Clark now lives) running thence along said old line S 44. 40 to a Hickory, thence W. 21 to a red oak, thence to a Stake, thence N. 35 to a Stake, thence S 35 W. 22 to a Stake thence S. 30 E. 25 to a Hickory, thence S 60. E 13. 50 to a Hickory, thence S 10 N. 12 to a Dogwood, thence S 71 W. 46. 60 to a Stake, thence S. 7 to a Stake, thence W. 10 to a Stake thence S. 30 W. 12 to a Post Oak, thence S 45 N. 5 to a chernut thence S 55 N. 28. 50 to a Stake thence N. 25 W. 20 to a Walnut thence N 50 E. 7 to a Hickory, thence S 80 E. 3. 10 to a red oak thence N. 30 E. 9 to a pine, thence N. 85 E. 10. 65 to a Hickory thence S. 65 E. 11. 50 to a chernut, thence N. 19 to a Stake, thence
