Know all men by these Presents that I John Paul of the Island of Jamaica, a Colony of the Kingdom of Great Britain for and in consideration of the love and affection I bear to my beloved Wife and Daughter Eliza Paul the Elder and Eliza Paul the Younger, all my Negroes in the district of Greenville in the State of South Carolina, that is to say Candish, Sarah, Louisa, Sylpha, Lydia, Anne, Jack, Peice, together with the increase to be equally divided between them; To have and to hold, the said Negro Slaves to them and their Heirs forever. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this 5th day of Oct^r 1811.

Know all men by these presents that I Clements Hooper of Greenville District in the State aforesaid for and in consideration of one hundred and thirty dollars to me in hand paid by Tho^s. Redman of this State and district aforesaid I have granted bargained & sold & by these Presents do grant bargain sell & convey unto Thomas Redman his heirs and assigns forever all that tract or parcel of land containing 139 acres it ^{being} part of a tract of seven hundred and twenty two acres originally granted to James Hilgou situated in the State & district aforesaid on both sides of
