Together with all and singular the rights members hereditaments & appurtenances to the said premises belonging; or in any wise incident or appertaining; To have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said William Christopher his heirs and assigns forever. And I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors and Administrators to Warrant & defend all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said William Christopher his heirs and assigns "against" myself my heirs executors administrators and assigns, and against all & singular the claims of every other person or persons whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof. Know all men by these Presents that I Arthur Clark of the district and State aforesaid for and in consideration of the sum of four hundred dollars to me paid by John Clark of said State and district have granted bargained sold and released & by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said John Clark a plantation and part of a tract of land that was originally granted to William Reed for 691 acres and signed by Governor Pinckney on the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of March 1792, lying in the State and district aforesaid on the waters of Saluda River, beginning on a Post Oak and running N. 10 ch. to a Post Oak, thence N. 45 E. 37 to a red Oak Sapling, thence N. 45 W. 10 to a Stake, thence N. 70 E. 35.50 to a Post Oak, thence S 53 E. 31. to a White Oak thence to Peter Ackers line & on S. line unto Jane Clarks line, thence to the beginning corner including two hundred eighty eight acres, be the same more or less. Together with all and singular the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances thereunto belonging, or any wise appertaining or incident to said premises.
