

18. the meanders to a maple corner on the bank of s<sup>d</sup> Creek, thence S 57° W 28  
Ch. to the beginning Stake Corner, which includes the whole lands intended  
to be conveyed. Together, with all and singular the rights, members,  
Hereditaments, and appurtenances to the said premises belonging, or  
in any wise incident or appertaining; To have and to hold all and  
singular the premises before mentioned unto the said William Cunningham  
his heirs and assigns forever. And I do hereby bind myself my  
heirs executors and administrators to warrant and for ever defend all  
and singular the said premises unto the said William Cunningham his  
heirs and assigns against myself my heirs, and against every person  
whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.  
And in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my  
seal the twenty fifth day of January in the year of our Lord one  
thousand eight hundred and nineteen, and in the forty third year  
of the Independence of the United States of America.

18. The State of South Carolina. Know all men by these Presents that Whereas  
John Lofter and Wm. D. Bowen on the thirteenth day of November and the  
fourth day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred &  
sixteen, by their deeds in writing under their hands and seals duly recorded  
in the Clerk's Office of Greenville district in book N. pages 86, 87, 88, 89 & 90, the  
first of October 1817, for and in consideration of the sum of eight hundred &  
thirty dollars to them in hand paid by Joseph and William Barton did grant  
bargain sell and convey unto the said Joseph and William Barton, jointly certain  
plantations, tracts or parcels of land whereon the said Lofter then lived, lying  
on both sides of the sink hole fork of Tiger river and Barton's fork of said river  
in the district of Greenville and State aforesaid; containing three hundred  
and forty acres, more or less; bounded as by reference to the said deeds may  
appear. Now know ye that I the said Joseph Barton in order to make division  
and partition of the said tract of land, between myself and the said William  
Barton, and in consideration of a like conveyance to me this day executed, by  
the said William Barton for part of the above described tracts, HAVE granted  
bargained sold and released, and by these presents do grant bargain sell  
and release unto the said William Barton, all my right title claim interest &  
demand whatsoever, of in or to all and singular that part of the tracts  
of land above mentioned which lays on the North or North East side of a  
Creek road and shoal path, to a rock, thence a straight line to a white oak,
