


The same being granted to John Fords to him the 19th day of February one thousand seven hundred & ninety one by his Excellency Charles Pickens Esq: Govern^r & commander for the time being. Together with all and singular the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any wise appertaining. To have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said John Corbin and his heirs forever, and we do hereby bind ourselves our heirs Executors & administrators to warrant and forever defend the appurtenances, premises unto the said John Corbin from us and our heirs and from any other person or person claiming the same or any part thereof. In witness whereof we have hereunto set our hands & seals this 24th October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and six.
