This Indenture made this thirteenth day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety nine and in the twenty third year of the Independence of the United States of America, between William Cannon of the State of South Carolina and County of Greenville of the one part, and Mary Barns of the State aforesaid and County of Greenville of the other part; Witnesseth, that the said William Cannon for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred and twenty dollars to him in hand paid already by the said Mary Barns, hath bargained and sold and by these presents doth bargain sell and make over and confirm unto the said Mary Barns her heirs and assigns one certain tract or parcel of land containing one hundred acres, be the same more or less, said "land" situated in the State aforesaid and County of Greenville beginning at a lightwood stake from thence to a Chestnut, from thence to a black gum from thence to a Chestnut from thence to beginning, being part of a tract of land run by Thomas Brummitt, and by him conveyed to John Covenhoven and from Covenhoven to John Glas - lines agreed on by said Glas & Covenhoven. To have and to hold the said premises to her the said Mary Barns her heirs and assigns, against myself my heirs and assigns, & against all and every "Person" whomsoever lawfully claiming the same, and I do warrant & forever defend the above land to the said Mary Barns and her heirs & assigns forever.
