Bourne the following property, to wit, one crib a parcel of corn supposed to contain thirty barrels. To have and to hold all and singular the aforesaid corn unto the aforesaid B. Bourne his heirs Exec^{rs} Adm^{rs} or assigns for ever provided always nevertheless, that if the said J.
