




The State of South Carolina Know all men by these presents that I Wm. Jones  
of Greenville district in the State aforesaid in consideration of one hundred  
and forty dollars to me paid by Joseph McCollough of the State and district  
aforesaid have granted bargain sold and released and by these presents  
do grant bargain sell & release unto the said Joseph McCollough  
all that plantation or tract of land containing fourteen acres  
(Or the same more or less) situate in the district of Greenville lying on the  
branches of horse creek waters of Rudy River. Beginning on a red oak  
sapling 3 x thence S 35<sup>o</sup> E 22.50 lks to a stake 3 x bounding on the S. William  
Jones land thence S 70<sup>o</sup> W 9.00 to stump 3 x thence N 22<sup>o</sup> W 17.50 to a  
stake 3 x thence N 6<sup>o</sup> W 10 to the beginning bounding on the S. Joseph  
McCollough. Together with all and singular the rights, members  
& appurtenances, and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in  
any wise incident or appertaining. To have and to hold all and singular  
the premises before mentioned unto the said Jo. McCollough his heirs & assigns,  
forever. And I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors & admors  
to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises  
unto the said Joseph McCollough his heirs and assigns against myself &  
my heirs and against every other person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the  
same or any part thereof. Witness my hand and seal this 13<sup>th</sup> day of November in  
the year of our Lord 1819 and in the 43<sup>d</sup> year of the Independence of the United  
States of America. Signed, sealed and delivered in the presence of
