Peter Sullivant of Spartanburg district for & in consideration of the
sum of two hundred and fifty dollars to me paid by Stephen
Johnson of Greenville district have granted, bargained, sold and
released & by these presents do grant, bargain, sell & release unto
the said Stephen a tract or parcel of land laying & being in the
district of Greenville afores. on both sides of Gumms creek of
So. pacolata river. Beginning on the S. side of the creek at the mouth
of a branch called the rock house branch & thence up the meandering
of the branch to the head thereof to a white oak a corner made
for John Whittier, thence with his line a S. course, as near
the course of the branch, to black oak saplin Whittiers corner
on Robt. Goodgins line, thence N 70 W. with his line to a
chestnut, thence S 40 W. 10 ch. to a small chestnut, thence
W 60 E to a hickory, thence N 15 W 25 ch. to a red oak near
a branch, thence down the meander of the same, to Gumms creek
afores, near the mouth of another branch, that empties on the N.
side, thence up the several meanders to the fork, & thence up the
right hand fork to the head thereof to a stake on a line of a sur-
vey formerly made for Rich^d Brasil, thence along said line a N 8 E
direction until it intersects with John Whittiers line of the land he
purchased of Willy S Brown & thence with his line to the begin-
ning, including the plantation whereon I lately lived containing
by estimation three hundred acres be the same more or less being lands
given me by W. S. Brown. Together with all and singular the
rights, members, hereditaments & appurtenances therunto belong-
ing or in any wise appertaining. To have & to hold the same
