 Greenville District <sup>332</sup> That presents that  
 I William Henson of the state and District aforesaid in consideration of the sum of three hundred and sixty dollars to me in hand paid by Thomas Roe of the District of Pendleton and state aforesaid have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Tho<sup>s</sup>. Roe all that parcels or tract of land containing two hundred acres more or less lying in the District of Greenville on the east side of Rudy River being part of a tract of land originally granted to John Carr and a part of a tract granted to John Harrison Beginning on a Maple corner at the foot of the river on Semrod Underwood line running an easterly course with the road to a poplar corner, thence northwardly to a black oak corner on John W. Hansels line thence on to Carrs old black corner, thence with Carrs old line to a poplar corner on the river, thence down the river keeping the meanders of the same to the beginning corner. Together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging, or in any wise incident or appertaining, to have and to hold
