 consideration of the sum of fifty dollars to me in hand
 paid by General Howard the receipt whereof is hereby ack-
 nowledged that I have granted bargained sold aliened con-
 veyed and released and by these presents do grant bargain
 sell and conveyance and release unto the said
 General Howard of the said State and District a parcel of
 land containing twenty five acres be the same more or less
 it being a part of an earlier grant of six hundred and
 forty acres of land to John Bedman by his Excellency
 Benjamin Grenade Esqr on the 21st of January A.D. 1785
 of which two hundred and twenty acres was conveyed
