now lies situate in the district and State aforesaid on duncans  
branch waters of Rudy River containing two hundred and twenty

land originally granted to Seconias Langston the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of April  
1786. and part of a another tract believed to be originally granted  
to said Langston and Robert Duncan the first day of August
