Know all men by these presents that I Benjamin Benson of the State and district aforesaid for the consideration of the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars to me in hand paid by David Armstrong of the same State & district have granted bargained and sold & released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said David Armstrong all that tract or parcel of land beginning on Enoch Bensons red oak corner on the south side of Beaver dam Creek thence west to a pine corner thence near the same course to Solomon Camps corner thence a long said line a south course a cross Woolfs Creek to a line surveyed for Elizabeth Young thence East along said line a cross Woolfs Creek to a Red Oak corner thence north to the beginning including twenty five acres of land more or less together with all and singular the Rights members hereditaments & appurtenances to the sd premises belonging or in any wise appertaining to have and to hold all and singular the said premises above mentioned unto David Armstrong his heirs Executors or assigns to have and forever defend against myself or heirs or any one claiming any part or parts thereof Given under my hand this the 12th of February 1823.
