To all to whom these presents shall come, I, J. W. Crawford Sheriff of Greenville District, and State aforesaid, send greeting; whereas, by virtue of sundry writs of fieri facias issued out of the Court of Common Pleas, held for the District of Greenville tested the first Monday after the fourth Monday in March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty two at the suit of Thomas G. Walker, Alexander Sloan, William J. Jany and Baylis J. Earle to me directed commanding me that of the goods and chattels, land and tenements of Robert B.
