

Writs of fieri facias issued out of the Court of Common Pleas, held for the District of Greenville tested the third day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty three at the suit of Thomas Hamilton to me directed commanding me that of the goods and chattels, lands and tenements of William Perle and Joseph McCullough to levy the sum of nine hundred and eighty three dollars damages and cost. I have seized and taken of the lands and tenements of the said William Perle and Joseph McCullough all that certain piece parcel and tract of land containing four hundred and forty seven more or less situate and being in the district of Greenville and State aforesaid on the waters of Ruddy River and horse creek a part of which said tract of land is as originally granted to Thomas Hamilton, and a part originally granted to Thomas McDonald which last part was conveyed by the said Thomas McDonald to the said Thomas Hamilton and by the said Thomas Hamilton conveyed to Joseph McCullough by and bearing date the eighth day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty which is recorded in the Registers office for the District aforesaid in Book L page 2175 & 2176. Having the following course and boundaries beginning on a white oak 3x running N. 60 E. 46 to a stake 3x binding on the land of George & John Honey thence N. 30 W. 6. 25 to a Hickory 3x thence N. 75 E. 13 to a stake 3x thence N. 14 E. 16. 50 to a red oak 3x thence N. 70 E. 4 to an ash corner 3x on the branch thence up the meanders of said branch to a stake 3x binding on James Cameron land thence S. 60 W. 62. 25 to a beach on the creek 3x binding on Hubert Sullivan land thence down the meanders of said creek to a Holly 3x thence S. 30 E. 17 chains to the beginning white oak corner 3x binding on James Cameron land and whereas the said premises with their appurtenances since the seizure by me made by virtue of the said writ of fieri facias before mentioned have been exposed to sale at public vendue and purchased by Hubert Sullivan Sheriff of the district and State aforesaid for the sum of one thousand and two dollars being the highest sum that was bid therefor Now know ye that I John W.
