 bargain sell & release unto the said Jesse Mayfield a certain parcel
 of land lying in Greenville District & State of South Carolina on the
 Middle Fork of Saluda River and the branches thereof all that
 part of a tract or parcel of land which lays on the the south
 side of said River originally granted to John Wood by patent
 bearing date 1786. Reference being had to said Grant will give
 the courses & corners on said so. side of the River, also one tract
 or parcel laying on the so. side of said River beginning at a
 white Oak corner so. 20 W. 76 ch. to a red oak thence so. 84 W. 4 ch
 25 ft. to a Spanish Oak thence so. 30 W. 10 ch to a chestnut thence
